Achievers of the term (Autumn 2015)


The teachers had a difficult choice as so many children have made fantastic progress in many areas of the curriculum but the following children were chosen as achievers of the autumn term:

Parents' Forum

Mrs Dunn and Mr Murray, our Achievement for All coach, met with our parents' forum this month to discuss our current behaviour policy. Comments were made and several suggestions were put forward:

- One parent commented that the new system had been used to sort a problem her son was having with an older child;
- Another parent suggested we might need more rewards for good behaviour;
- There was a suggestion to have an achiever of the day as well as an achiever of the week:
- Peer mentoring to encourage good behaviour was another suggestion;
- Some parents felt that other parents needed to deal more efficiently with their child's behaviour;
- The introduction of school values to be instilled in our pupils was deemed to be an appropriate way forward and our children should understand those values from an early age;
- The values should be introduced in a structured way through weekly lessons and assemblies:
- Rewards should be linked to the values on a daily basis;
- It was queried whether children who apologise after restorative conversations really mean it;

The forum also discussed the possibility of holding meetings after school for working parents and giving more notice for achievement assemblies.

We will be discussing these suggestions further in the future.

Below is a message from the council about e safety.



There have been some issues reported by youngsters using the ooVoo app, who have received offensive and sexually explicit contacts from strangers.

Children and parents should be advised that the app is not suitable for children under the age of 13 and that the default privacy settings (which allow complete strangers to videoconference with the user) can render it quite hazardous even to older children.

ooVoo 's terms and conditions limit the use of the app to children over 13. However this does not make its use illegal, just in breach of their agreement with ooVoo.

We would like to remind parents to regularly check their children's devices, discuss the use of social media apps with their children and to ensure parental controls are enabled on devices. For older children it would be wise to change the privacy settings so that they set them so no strangers can contact them. In the settings section, go to 'Privacy & Security' and it asks 'When people search ooVoo, who can find me?' They should then either select 'People who know my email address or ooVoo ID' or 'No one'. If a child reports either receiving or being asked to share sexually explicit images this should be regarded as a safeguarding concern, the device should not be used (to preserve any evidence) and your local police should be informed in the usual way.
