Wider re-opening of school

June 2020 (Covid-19)

These rules are based on the DfE's "Planning Guide for Primary Schools, 25 May 2020." School will be a different place when pupils return to school and the changes we have had to make in order to keep our school family safe are reflected in this appendix to our behaviour policy.

Expectations of Parents/Carers

- ONLY 1 Parent/Carer to enter school site to bring child(ren) to school
- Pre-school children to stay with Parent/Carer at all times (e.g. Buggy, holding hands, reins)
- Ensure social distance from other adults whilst waiting for doors to open as per government guidance (please do not arrive too early to avoid congregation)
- Parents/Carers not to enter school building
- Collect your child as soon as possible if called regarding illness/symptoms
- Stick to allocated drop off/pick up times if allotted time is missed, please do not bring your child into main reception until 9:30
- Parents/Carers to collect child if not adhering to new rules
- If parents are not sending their child/ren back to school, encourage children to complete work set by the teacher remotely or a work pack
- Parents to contact school if experiencing problems with remote education

Expectations of Children

- Normal Roseberry behaviour rules/rewards/sanctions still apply
- Children not to bring in anything from home except named filled water bottles and named packed lunch boxes/bags.
- Children to enter the building separately and patiently, queueing if necessary at a 2m distance
- Children to wash hands/sanitise when entering the building; before and after playtimes/lunchtimes and leaving the building at home time
- Children to follow signs and special routes in place (e.g. one-way system)
- Children to stay at a social distance of 2m as much as possible (adults in school to remind children when necessary)
- Children to stay within their group 'bubble' at all times, including playtimes.

- Children not to play games that include touching others (e.g. tag, stuck in the mud etc...)
- Children not sticking to the 'no touching' rules will be reminded and parents informed to support with reinforcement
- Any coughing/spitting on another pupil will result in pupil being sent home
- Due to the social distancing requirement, Team Teach techniques (safe physical restraint) will not be used. Team Teach de-escalation strategies will still be used if applicable. However, any pupils whose behaviour might endanger themselves or others will be sent home.
- Children to use a tissue for sneezing and/or coughing and put used tissues in lidded bins
- If children haven't got time to get a tissue, they should cough or sneeze into their elbow.
- Children to avoid touching their mouths, noses and eyes and follow the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' advice
- Children must tell an adult if they are experiencing symptoms of coronavirus
- Children must not share resources but use their own equipment
- Children must tell an adult when they require the toilet and visit individually if possible to maintain social distancing

For pupils who are not returning to school:

• Pupil to continue their education at home either remotely or completing work packs set by their teachers.
