Shiver me timbers! The children in the Robins Nursery have enjoyed the launch of their new Pirates topic.








Year 3/4 Eagles have been using pasta in sentences to help them understand where speech punctuation goes.






Year 3/4 Falcons have started their new Science unit—States of Matter. They have investigated the similarities and differences between solids, liquids and gases.

They also had great fun playing Bulldog during their Daily Mile time on the field. This is another way in which we are developing our 'Live Well, Live Long' Curriculum Foundation.




#### New members of staff
