As effective learners we will:

Show our own interests.

Take on a role in our play.

Take risks and try new activities.

Try again when something doesn't work the first time. Set our own goals.

Use what we know to shape our play ideas.

As readers we will:

Read autumn stories such as Oliver's vegetables, Goodbye Summer Hello autumn and The Witch with a Twitch.

We will look at non-fiction texts and find out information about autumn.

We will talk about ourselves, families and pets through different books including The Family Book, They and The Colours of Us. We will begin to hear and recognise the sounds around us and the of autumn including animals, leaves rustling and rain.





As writers we will:

Write labels for our autumn table and different vegetables Write our name and learn initial sounds
Blend and segment the sounds in simple words.

As mathematicians we will:

Subitise (look at a small group of object and instantly know the amount without counting) within 3.

Focus on counting skills

Explore how all numbers are made of 1s

Look at how the numbers 3 and 4 can be made with smaller numbers.

Subitise objects and sounds

Use the language of more than and fewer than.

As explorers and investigators, we will:

Discover the sights, sounds and smells of autumn. Identify features of the place we live and natural world.

Understand the effect of the changing season on the natural world around.

Exploring our autumn investigation table, we will collect leaves and conkers to learn about changes we see.

Comment on images of familiar situations in the past.

As healthy movers we will:

Handle tools in the classroom safely and effectively.


Play on climbing equipment and learn how to move under, over and through, as in the Leaf Hunt story.

As communicators we will:

Listen carefully in a variety of situations.

Talk about what we have found out about the signs of autumn, connecting one idea to another using connectives.

Engage in story times and talk about familiar stories.

Ask questions to find out more and check our understanding.

Learn autumn and harvest songs.



As individuals and friends, we will:

Explore differences between ourselves and others.

Learn about different families, seeing themselves as an individual.

Learn about the importance of sharing and being kind to one another to build relationships with others.

Practise our manners; learn about right and wrong behaviours and the importance of rules to get alona.
